Life Link III was formed in 1985 as one of the first non-profit consortium programs in the country to transport critically ill patients by helicopter. Our Life Link III consortium is a great model of collaboration, bringing together ten leading hospital systems in the Midwest. Because Life Link III has always focused on clinical excellence, we continually embrace and introduce new technologies into our critical care medical transport practice. We provide rapid on-scene emergency response and inter-facility transport via helicopter and airplane for patients requiring critical care. Life Link III's transportation services are accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Medical Transportation Systems (CAMTS), ensuring the highest standards of quality and safety are met. Life Link III operates eight helicopter bases in Alexandria, Blaine, Brainerd, Duluth, Hibbing, and Willmar in Minnesota and Rice Lake and Marshfield in Wisconsin. As one of the largest hospital-based non-profit consortium programs in the United States, Life Link III has a 34-year history of demonstrating its dedication to improving patient care and transport safety.



- Listening to the needs of our consortium members and industry and partnering with them to help advance critical care access in the Midwest








Hennepin EMS and Life Link III partner up for Super Bowl LII

Super Bowl LII brought an influx of visitors to the Twin Cities in February. Hennepin EMS recognized early on that a portion of their operations would need to relocate to support EMS operations during this time. This was necessary to not only maintain the level of service to those residing in Hennepin County but also to those visiting for the Super Bowl. Life Link III was proud to support Hennepin EMS and provide its Minneapolis office to accommodate a portion of their operations. This type of cooperation between EMS agencies demonstrates a strong commitment to our patients and dedication to providing the best care for our communities.







One of our latest clinical capabilities to be featured on-board is point-of-care ultrasound testing. This technology has many out-of-hospital applications including assessing fluid status, evaluating lung and cardiac function, and assessing for abdominal bleeding. Just as in the hospital, ultrasound provides flight clinicians with ultrasonic guidance for procedures such as thoracostomy, pericardiocentesis and IV insertion, as well as guiding fluid resuscitation.



Life Link III surpasses 15,000 flight hours in Leonardo AW119Kx

Leonardo Helicopters announced in October 2018 that Life Link III has logged more than 15,000 flight hours and transported over 8,000 patients with its fleet of 10 Leonardo AW119Kx helicopters. 
Services. "Our clinical staff undergo extensive, continual in-service education to ensure the most advanced critical care and technology are provided to patients requiring specialized care."

Life Link III Answers the Call Through New & Innovative Technology



OneLink™ - New Desktop & Mobile App Aims to Streamline Request Process & Reduce Launch Times

Air medical transport is now a click of a button away. OneLink™, Life Link III's desktop and mobile app, is designed to allow hospitals and first responders to immediately request an aircraft when critical care transport is necessary. OneLink™ connects a mobile

device, tablet or desktop directly to Life Link III's computer aided dispatch (CAD) system to get the request initiated as quickly as possible – when time is of the essence and the patient condition is critical.

Developed in partnership with Flight Vector[™], OneLink[™] is available for both scene incidents and inter-facility transports. Users can submit a request for air medical transport and track an immediate response. If a Life Link III aircraft has been assigned, the requester will receive notification of the flight status and will be able to track the estimated time of arrival through the OneLink[™] flight map. Life Link III's OneLink[™] can be accessed by downloading the app through the Apple Store, Google Play, or by accessing the desktop version.






State-of-the-Art Communication Center

Life Link III's Communication Center is available 24/7 to assist with air medical transport. Our Life Link III Communication Specialists use the latest technology to provide the most efficient service while maintaining a focus on safety. Ensuring our Communication Specialists have state-of-the-art equipment and training is one of the key pieces of successful patient transports. Life Link III is equipped with the latest Radio over Internet Protocol (RoIP) for both Minnesota and Wisconsin. Our Communication Center utilizes satellite Global Positioning System (GPS) to monitor all transports.

Using a computer-driven algorithm methodology, the Communication Specialists can quickly determine the closest appropriate aircraft to the scene or facility for immediate dispatch. Through its 'One Call' system, Life Link III works collaboratively with other air medical transport services to dispatch the most appropriate aircraft, whether it's Life Link III's or another service. Life Link III works closely with 911 dispatch, law enforcement, fire, EMS, and hospitals to provide the most efficient process possible.

Clinical Spotlight: Warming Measures

Life Link III is proud to provide the highest level of patient care through its innovative clinical capabilities. Warming measures focus on maintaining the patient's body temperature to prevent hypothermia and avoid additional stress to a patient in an already critical situation. Life Link III offers continuous invasive and non-invasive temperature monitoring capabilities that guide our rewarming measures. Some examples of warming measures Life Link III has on-board include:



Hypothermia Bouffant Caps

The Hypothermia Bouffant Cap by Thermoflect® is designed to control the patient's temperature and prevent hypothermia by reflecting the body's radiant heat and banking it to safely and effectively warm the patient.



Belmont ®buddy lite ™ Fluid Warmer

Warming fluids plays a critical role in patient transport. The Belmont® buddy lite™ is designed to heat and deliver fluid to trauma patients and is essential to preventing hypothermia.



LifeBlanket™

The LifeBlanket[™] is a high performance, all-weather patient packaging system designed to maintain the patient's normal temperature during transport. This is especially important in the extreme Midwest climates we serve.



On-Board Fluid Warmer

The on-board fluid warmer is a feature of the Leonardo AW119Kx aircraft and is utilized to warm IV fluids before being administered to the patient.


Who and How We Served in 2018 & Transport Statistics

Uses of Revenue 2018


